Powder Usage:

- Captain, Lieutenant and Armourer currently in possession of company powder.
- Did not purchase any powder for 2020 season. Only one minor event at Memorial Day. No other use.
- Anticipate usual 1,500 + rounds for 2021 if we have a season. To be efficient, we can roll it all at once.
 - ➤ Estimated black powder budget should be \$350 for entire season (\$20.75 x 15 LB = \$311.25). Note the minor increase in cost.

- ➤In spite of the pandemic, the Stow MM Fife and Drums continued to hold weekly practice via zoom. Not ideal; cannot play together due to sound lag. Matt has recorded most of our fife music, sent these recordings to drummer Jeff, who then plays it to the group while drumming along. Each of the participants can then mute themselves and play along.
- Were able to meet 3 times during the summer when COVID numbers were low. We loaned two sets of company drums and straps to George and Ephraim Dunning, did some marching practice, and played music via Zoom to a couple of musicians who were unable to attend.
- ➤ We have also continued to provide fife lessons every week but on separate days. This has gone very well as, instead of group lessons, each student gets more attention through private lessons.
- We are very much looking forward to playing in person again.

- > Follow up from prior years:
 - Flags will require cleaning. Flags should be retired and replaced within the next few years (wearing out)



Stow Minutemen Scholarship Application

The Stow Minutemen Company wishes to encourage an active interest in, and understanding of, American Colonial history. Because the Company is kept alive by many families and individuals who represent the people who lived in Stow in 1775, we wish to reward and encourage this family tradition among our members by offering scholarships to young people for the pursuit of further education and/or training. The <u>deadline</u> for applications is always by <u>11:00 pm on the second Saturday following our annual Trail March to Concord on Patriot's Day in April</u>. Awards will be presented prior to the end of June. Amount of the award will depend on the number of qualified applicants.

Requirements for application:

Must be a currently active, participating member of the Stow Minutemen Company for at least three consecutive years. Applicants must participate in at least four events, two of which are paid. The Awards Committee will determine how active an applicant may have actually been over this time. At the time of application, must be at least a senior in high school, and no older than 24 years of age. Must fill out the following form (may simply type in the answers, save, and attach to an email). In addition to completed application form, must also include:

Letter of recommendation

Proof of acceptance or attendance at an institution of higher learning

Resume

Essay

No award recipient shall be eligible for a second award at a later date.

Proposed Company Purchases — 2021 Season

Company Trailer Recap:

- Committee formed of Bob Stokes, Ryan Hayward, David Walrath and Thomas Johnson (with input from Craig Schomp and Ron Richmond)
- ➤ 5x8 box trailer with pointed nose is about \$2,000, plus excise tax (2.5%), registration (\$20-\$40), and insurance (depends on carrier)
- Need hitch and hitch lock (\$20-40) or wheel lock (\$30-\$60) and a door lock (<\$20).
- ➤\$3,000 budget line item was approved in 2019 with \$250 thereafter. Asking to renew at \$3,500 for 2021 budget.



Ongoing Discussions:

- ➤ Who has vehicle to haul? We could rent one for weekend if necessary.
- ➤ How to we ensure drivers have proper insurance to haul? Tow packages needed for drivers.
