Powder Usage:

➤Captain, Lieutenant and Armourer currently in possession of company powder.

Purchased 10lbs of black powder.
Shortage so we should buy more.
Limited use; limited activity.
Anticipate usual 1,500 + rounds for 2022 if we have a season. To be efficient, we can roll it all at once.

Estimated black powder budget should be \$200 for entire season (\$28.25 x 5 LB = \$141.25). Note the increase in cost. GEOX Powder went out of business/for sale in 2021.
